






MISSIONS - From the Global Outreach Commitee

"Address the Stress" Anxiety Workshop

Salem Kid Start Kindergarten will be sponsoring an hour-long workshop on anxiety and stress in children on Thursday, April 11, 2024, from 6:00-7:00 pm in the church social hall. Amber Iller, LICSW, a clinical counselor experienced in working with children with anxiety, will be speaking on how anxiety manifests itself in children and what children and parents can do to manage it.

Joanna Vorce has attended this presentation twice and we wish to make this valuable presentation to the school and church families.

Amber is a highly recommended local clinician with a proven track record with children. Specializing in working with children from ages 4 to 11, her practice is called Sandbox Therapy. She works with families and individuals in that direct and empathic style, identifying strengths and building on them. She uses a variety of approaches, including Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Play Therapy, Narrative Therapy, Solution Focused Therapy as well as Relaxation Strategies and Emotions Regulation Skills.

The pandemic beginning in 2020 created distress for all individuals and families in one way or another. This distress became a catalyst for Amber to explore how she could diversify her services and offer as much support as she could to families in her community. She offers individual and family therapy as well as additional services including workshops, presentations and consultations. Amber's approach is strength based, child centered, and varied in approach. Her presentation is sure to offer practical information for any who have or work with children, whether we navigate day-to-day or more extraordinary stress.

It is essential that we talk about these difficult and complex topics. We want to partner with families, equipping parents and caregivers to manage stress in the lives of our children and families during challenging times.

This presentation is being offered at no cost to families.



The American Red Cross announced a huge blood shortage emergency. The shortage of blood products is beyond critical. Sunday Message Series April-May, Romans 9-16

Last Fall we journeyed together for 8 weeks through the book of Romans chapters 1-8. That was an incredibly fruitful time as we uncovered the theme 'From Enemies to Adoption'. Each Sunday we followed Paul's argument in the first half of Romans that brought us from enemies

of God in chapter 1 to life in the Spirit as adopted children of God in chapter 8.

Starting in April, we will continue our Journey through the Book of Romans chapters 9 – 16. We will see many individual themes in these last chapters: the sovereignty of God, salvation for the world, God's faithful promise, God's election, a faithful remnant of believers, overcoming evil with good, true love, Christian submission, accepting diverse beliefs, liberty in the non-essentials, living in unity & harmony in the church, incredible coworkers, and divisive people.



I hope that you will get excited with me to jump into the last half of Romans during April and May! I am confident that our lives and our church will be transformed each week as we focus together on this rich letter.

Good afternoon Centerpoint parents, teachers, and children's ministry volunteers!

As you know we love kids at Centerpoint and we've intentionally created programs and spaces for kids to learn, grow, play, and enjoy. We have a large group of caring and committed parents, teachers, and volunteers who sacrifice themselves weekly for this task! Thank you for making Centerpoint an awesome place to raise up the next generation in Christ.

We've updated the *Kid's Zone* play area on the right side of the social hall which is adjacent to the *Kid's Game Room*. This week we've added several new games to this area to create a space for kids to constructively play and enjoy Sunday mornings during coffee hour.

We'll also take this opportunity to refresh our community guidelines for kids. Parents, please review these with your kids:

1. No running in the halls or through the church building. We are concerned especially for our elderly who could easily be knocked down and injured.

2. Children should not be upstairs or in other areas of the church unattended by a supervising adult.

3. Play games with self-control. This is a confined & sometimes crowded indoor space where flying balls, paddles, etc. can injure someone.

4. No rough-housing even among siblings. Wrestle at home but not at church.

5. Inappropriate language, gestures, or innuendos are not befitting a follower of Christ, and are not allowed.

6. Always see how you can include the outsider, the lonely person, or the newcomer. This is befitting a follower of Christ!

7. Treat others with love, respect, and kindness. Do to others as you would want done to you.

8. Treat games, equipment, and church property respectfully and responsibly. Especially do not sit on the game tables.


9. Clean up your mess, trash, and spills; and put away game equipment when you are done. We now have wood cup holders for the stage area in the social hall.

10. Parents are responsible for their children during coffee hour. Parents don't need to 'hover', but they should be aware of where they are, how they are conducting themselves, and be ready to redirect or correct behavior.

Thank you for taking time to review these good community guidelines with your children and to equip them to lead in Christ among their peers. We all work together to create a great kingdom environment at Centerpoint where all kids can play, learn, grow, and thrive!
